

Electric Candle - Agate Embed

INSTRUCTIONS

A truly stunning product, the Agate Embedded Electric Candle is fairly easy to make.



Note: These instructions are provided for informational purposes only. Your results may vary.

Caution: Candle making involves the use of chemicals, heat sources, hot waxes, and sharp objects. Due care must taken at all times. **SAFTY FIRST!**

Electric Candle - Agate Embed

Materials Needed

- “Thin” Grubby Electric Candle Mold
- Thin Agate Slice(s)
 - Up to 3 can be used
 - Slices should be aprox 2” x 3”
- Wax (Scent and Dye optional)
- Cord w/Bulb
- Trimming Knife
- Small Torch or Heat Gun
- Soft Cloth
- Soft Work Area (I.e. Pot Holder, Hand Towel, etc)



Instructions

1. Carefully insert Agate Slice(s) into the mold

- **CAUTION:** Agate Slices can be sharp.

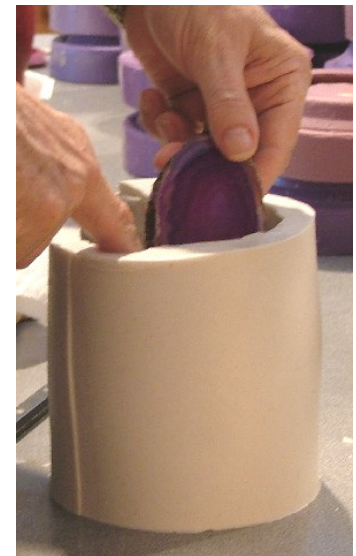
Take care not to damage the mold when inserting the slice.

- **HINT:** Place the 1st Agate Slice directly opposite the mold “Cord Channel” (see Fig. 1)

2. Pour wax into mold (refill if needed)

3. Wait for candle to COMPLETELY cool

4. Carefully demold cool candle on Soft Work Area

5. Carefully remove wax from front (outside candle) of Agate Slice(s) with Trimming Knife (see Fig. 3)

6. **Optional Step** - Carefully remove wax from back (inside candle) of Agate Slice(s) with Trimming Knife (see Fig. 2)

• **HINT:** Leave a small ‘lip’ around the edge to ensure the Agate Slice(s) remain firmly embedded

7. Using a Small Torch or Heat Gun, carefully melt wax around lip of Agate Slice to “smooth” the transition from wax to stone. This can be done to both the inside (see Fig. 4) and outside (see Fig. 5) of the candles

• **HINT:** Go slowly and lightly. Not too much heat/time is generally needed



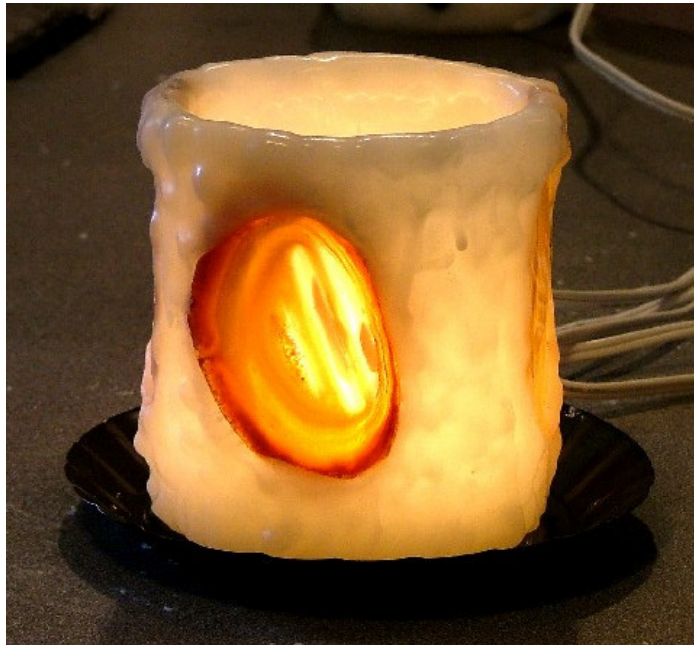

8. Clean up any smudged wax on Agate Slice(s) with Soft Cloth, if needed
9. Insert Cord and Bulb as normal.
